

Notice

1. Upon receipt of request from the High Court Bar Association, the last date to register the application for allotment of Advocates' Chambers currently open to 10639 Eligible Advocates, is hereby extended up to **05:59 PM on Tuesday i.e. 28.07.2026**. Thereafter, Phase II of the registration may be opened, at the earliest.
2. Those Eligible Advocates who are included in the **List B** (as published vide notice dated 17.07.2026 on the High Court's website) must get their data cured/corrected through the respective Bar Association latest by **06:00 PM on Monday i.e. 27.07.2026**. Only thereafter, they may be able to register in Phase II.
3. Those Eligible Advocates, (out of 10639 of first 11000 Eligible advocates in List A), who have not been able to register their application due to incorrect mobile no., mobile number no longer in their possession/use, **must submit** their correct mobile no. along with a valid proof of identity through the respective Bar Association, latest by 27.07.2026. Only thereafter, they would be able to register their application on the Portal in Phase II (subject to their data being corrected/completed, in the meantime).
4. After 28.07.2026, Phase II of registration shall be opened. Therein, registration shall be invited equal to the remaining chamber seats available, **only** from amongst the remaining Eligible Advocates i.e. those who may have removed deficiencies in accordance with Point nos. 2 & 3 above, and remaining advocates in List A (beyond the 11000th seniority position).
5. Those Eligible Advocates who have already registered their application on the Portal and desire to correct any information in any of the field(s) such as E-mail, Option for Chief Tenant/Co-Tenant, Bank Account No., Address etc. (**except their registered mobile number**), submitted by them, may further submit a written application to the office of Registrar (J) (Infrastructure-High Court), along with a printed copy of their Acknowledgment Form, clearly indicating the correction(s) required to be made, together with a valid proof of their identity.
